before assembling for our trek down the coast.



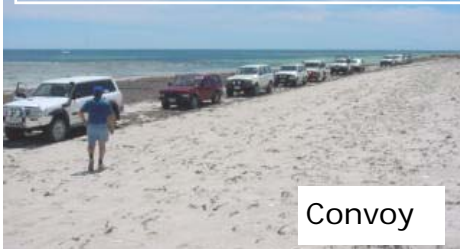
Life savers
