Fire Regulations

When is the 'Fire Danger Season'?

The Fire Danger Season is a period from mid Spring to late Autumn when fire restrictions apply. South Australia has 15 fire ban districts and the Fire Danger Season for each district differs slightly.

What is a 'Total Fire Ban Day'?

Total Fire Ban Days may be declared on days when extreme weather conditions (high temperature, high wind and low humidity) could cause fires to become uncontrollable. On a Total Fire Ban Day severe fire restrictions apply.

A ban may be declared in one or more fire ban districts and may even be declared across the whole State. Bans apply for 24 hours from midnight to midnight the following day. They are broadcast on television and radio from 6:00pm the day before.

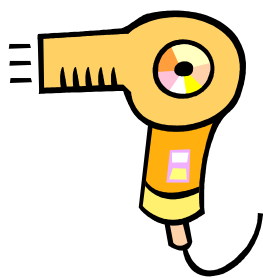

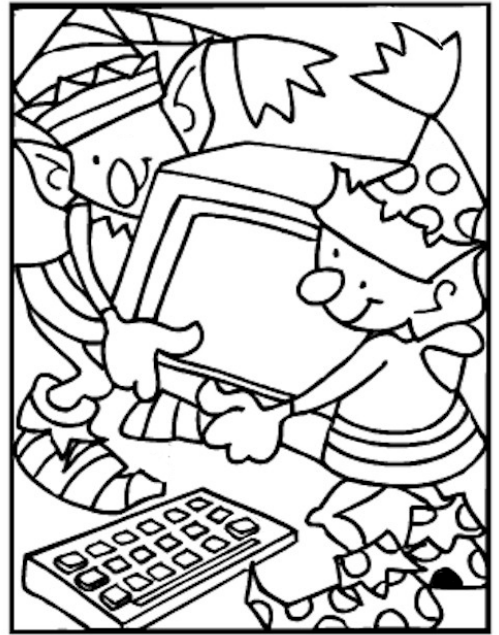

Christmas Fruit Cake Recipe

With only 50 days till Christmas here is a recipe to help you through the silly season. The annual fruitcake recipe that everyone loves, in case you lost your copy from last year Time to start baking!

Ingredients:

1 cup water
1 cup sugar
4 large eggs
2 cups dried fruit
1 tsp salt
1 cup brown sugar
3 oz lemon juice
1 cup nuts
1 gallon Absolut Vodka

First, sample the vodka to check for freshness. Take a large bowl.

Check the vodka again to be sure it is of the highest quality. Pour 1 level cup of the vodka and drink it.

Repeat.

Turn on the electric mixer; beat 1 cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add water, eggs and 1 tsp sugar and beat again.

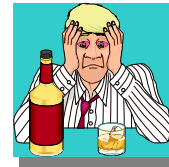
